The fish I am telling you about is a tuna..*



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Quand «dont» marque l'appartenance,  
on utilise WHOSE .

*The rabbit whose ears are long is eating.  
Le lapin dont les oreilles sont longues mange.*

The man whose pillow is comfortable is sleeping.


He is the worker whom I told you about yesterday.
